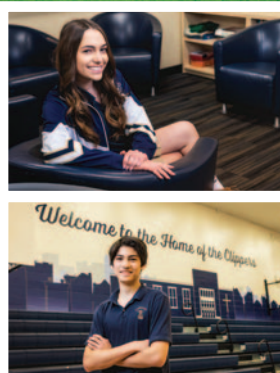

OUR MISSION

Archbishop Molloy High School is a Catholic Marist school which fosters an exemplary education in mind, body, and spirit for a diverse college bound population. At Molloy, individuals recognize their self-worth and develop a lifetime of Christian values, critical thinking, leadership skills, and service to others. Molloy has been recognized by *U.S. News & World Report* as an Outstanding American High School and was named an Exemplary Secondary School by the U.S. Department of Education.

ACADEMICS

Molloy offers a rigorous academic program that thoroughly prepares students for life. The curriculum includes a full range of Regents, honors, college, and Advanced Placement (AP) courses. Molloy currently has 25 AP courses available. Faculty and peer tutors are available before and after school to consult with students seeking additional help.

Administrators consistently evaluate and update our curriculum to best serve the needs and interests of today's students. Recent popular additions include Virtual Enterprise International, Amazon Future Engineer, Video Broadcasting, Robotics, and the AP Capstone Program.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Generations of exceptional student-athletes have called Molloy home. We offer 46 team sports for boys and girls, including 20 at the varsity level. Molloy also offers over 60 clubs and activities for students to explore their interests and identify their passions beyond the classroom. ADMISSIONS

Admission to Archbishop Molloy High School is competitive. Candidates must submit 6th, 7th, and 8th grade marks and standardized/NYS test scores (if taken). Applicants must also take the Test for Admission into Catholic High School (TACHS), which will take place virtually on Saturday, November 7, 2026. Enroll for the exam at www.tachsinfo.com. | TACHS code: 012. Merit Scholarships are available and subsequently awarded to students who score very well on the TACHS and earn marks in the 90s in 6th, 7th, and 8th grades. Additionally, students may be eligible to earn a Named Scholarship by submitting a Named Scholarship Application. Visit www.molloyhs.org/scholarships for more information.

FRESHMAN CAMP

Incoming freshmen have the opportunity to spend one week in July at the Marist Brothers Center at Esopus. At Freshman Camp, Molloy's rising 9th graders play games, attend Mass, and enjoy opportunities to make friends and meet teachers before the start of school in September.

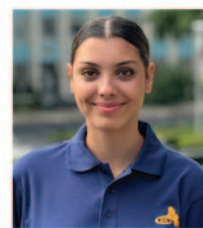

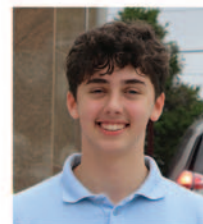
